KENDALL - THE HUB OF CLASSICAL MUSIC

Keeping with the well established Kendall tradition of presenting wonderful classical music events, November is no exception.

For lovers of philosophy and music, both senses can be indulged at **Kendall PhiloMusica on Sunday 16th November at the Kendall School of Arts.**

A one hour Pre-concert talk and discussion will take place from 11.30am when musician, philosopher and Associate Professor at the Sydney Conservatorium, Goetz Richter, will explore the links between Beethoven and Hegel, one of the most influential philosophers of the 19th century.

With time to have a picnic, lunch at Miss Nellie's Cafe or the Kendall S&C Club, the concert **"Beethoven's Genius"** will commence at 2pm.

In a first for Kendall, Kendall PhiloMusica presents the complete **Sonatas for piano and violin by Ludwig van Beethoven** in three performances in 2014 and 2015. These milestones of virtuosic chamber music will be performed by pianist **Jeanell Carrigan** and violinist **Goetz Richter** will feature four Sonatas by Beethoven (op. 23, op. 24, op 30,2 and op. 30,3) with the series to be completed in 2015 with two further performances of the remaining six sonatas.



Goetz Richter comments: "Some have linked Beethoven and the philosopher Hegel, these two giants of the 19th century, because they seem to approach the fundamental questions of life and art with similar methods. To be sure, there seems some infinity here, however, at the same time the differences are telling. It will be very exciting to explore a fabulous music mind, with the help of one of the greatest thinkers of our times followed by a performance of simply divine music."

Quota International Camden Haven

To mark the beginning of Carers' Week Quota International of Camden Haven hosted a day of respite for 30 special people who care for adult children, spouses and family members. The chance to have a day out is a real treat for them.

The group belong to Port Macquarie Carers Group who support parents and carers of people with disabilities. Quota members are well aware of the stresses and sacrifices made by the carers and wanted to do something to make the Carers Week celebrations special for them. A bus was supplied to transport the people from Port Macquarie to pilot beach where they were treated to a delicious morning tea. From there the group spent time in Laurieton doing some retail therapy followed by lunch at the L.U.S.C. One gentleman was heard to say how much he enjoyed the day out and on leaving said that he would now put his Carer's hat back on and resume his home duties.

This event is the second year Quota have provided the day out for the carers. Last year the group spent the day in Kendall and were overwhelmed by the many activities held in Kendall on Thursdays.

BIRD OF THE MONTH

SUPERB FAIRY WRENS are common in urban parks & gardens in small social groups which normally consist of 1 dominant male and several females & young birds. They forage for insects on the ground and low bushes. They have been labelled 'the least faithful birds in the world'! Females may be courted by up to 13 males in 1/2 and hour and 75% of young are sired by males from outside their group!



Their nest is a small dome shaped structure of grasses and other fine material usually placed in a low bush and constructed by the female. She incubates the eggs alone but both sexes and other group members help to feed the young chicks.

There are three other

species in the Wren family: Red-backed Wrens, Variegated and White-winged Wrens. The White



wrens are found in arid areas in all States except ACT and Tasmania.

During the hot weather in summer place a birdbath or shallow bowl near shrubbery in the shade and keep full of clean water - it will encourage birds to your backyard and they will certainly appreciate it.

KENDALL RESERVE TRUST - AGM 2014 - CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT

After a very busy year in 2013 it has been steady as she goes for the most part over the last 12 months. Maintaining the good condition of the Centre and managing our various businesses and ensuring that we continue to support the Kendall and district community in all that we do, have been at the centre of our activities.

The sanding and polishing of the Hall floor was the biggest renovation project carried out in the last year, funded by a partnership between Port Macquarie – Hastings Council Local Heritage Assistance Program, Kendall District Gardeners and the Meeting Place Cafe.

The Meeting Place continues to make a great contribution socially and financially to the wellbeing of locals and the Centre. After nine years at the helm David Buchan retired from its co-ordination and Reggie Crane took over. The transition was seamless to customers, with Reggie being a familiar face already. It's a mammoth task for any one volunteer to take on, and while there is a small army willing to support the Cafe by cooking, serving and cleaning, the overall responsibility nevertheless falls on the coordinator. As Reggie has indicated she wishes to retire from the role at the end of the year, it is up to the Trust to ensure the Meeting Place continues to operate effectively and that our volunteer staff are supported through the changeover process.

Bookends continues to flourish and there's no excuse for anyone who loves books and reading not to enjoy a wide selection of material. Thank you to all the volunteers who keep Bookends humming along in such a friendly way.

Music events continue to be staged in the Hall, with Kendall National Violin Competition, Kendall PhiloMusica, Sydney Conservatorium Mid North Coast Tour and the Australian Breastfeeding Association Hastings Group holding concerts. Feedback is always positive and our School of Arts Hall is one of the most popular venues in the area for music events because of its superior natural acoustics.

The monthly Folk Night, started up in March has now morphed into Kendall Music Exchange focussing on all types of music, giving locals a chance to strut their stuff and show what a wealth of talent is right under our noses.

Kendall District Gardeners keep our grounds around the buildings looking spruce as well as generously contributing funds to our various large-project needs such as the Hall floor renovation, generating income from their monthly meetings in the Hall and the Open Garden Program.

We were saddened by the death of Martin de Rose, husband of former Trustee Janice. Martin was a foundation member of the Garden Club and the members planted a commemorative tree outside the Hall in his honour. Janice suffered another blow scarcely a few months later with the mysterious disappearance of her grandson William, visiting her for the weekend. It seems too much for one person to bear and very unfair.

The Global Food Garden celebrated its second birthday with a Garden Party in May, which included a visit by Port Macquarie MP Leslie Williams, who reported the event in glowing terms in her speech to State Parliament.

We celebrated Seniors Week with a Property & Personal Security seminar and demonstration, funded by a Seniors Week Grant and including lunch provided by The Meeting Place. With support from a Kendall Op Shop grant we purchased the Arts Council's piano in May. This asset will ensure we continue to attract first class music events to our Hall and Kendall.

In July new Trustees were appointed, with Ruth Gallagher, Eunice (Topsy) Roberts and Richard Wilson joining re-appointed Trustees Tin Hta Nu, Allan Phelps, Warren Parkinson and Alvena Ferguson. Warren stepped up to take on the job of Secretary and Richard has been appointed vice-chair. Allan Phelps continues as treasurer. At its first meeting the new Trust stated its aim is to create closer relationships with all community activities and groups, for the betterment of Kendall and its residents. I wish to record here our thanks to retiring Trustees Janice de Rose, David Buchan and Wren Matthews. Personal letters of appreciation have been sent to these three special people.

Just about anything that is needed for local business or individuals can be catered for at the Centre, from Justice of the Peace attention, computer courses, Centrelink access, Trainlink tickets, taxation advice, copying and laminating, resumes, correspondence and assignment preparation, posters and flyers etc and the list goes on. One of the positives of the Centre's office staff is their willingness to have a go - so if we don't already do it and you need it - just ask. We do our best to oblige.

The monthly Chronicle continues to be read by just about everyone in the area - ably put together and edited by Judy Wilson. A large number of dedicated loyal advertisers help the Chronicle keep almost paying its way, although that is getting harder and harder to achieve.

Over the last few years the Centre has been upgraded and improved in so many ways that there is now little remaining to be done. The Artists' Dressing Room and adjacent storeroom renovations will be carried out within the next month and repairs to the ridge capping on a relatively small section of roof will also be done shortly. It is now up to the Trustees to ensure the standard of maintenance is continued so that the Centre and its various assets and buildings remain in top condition.

There are many people to thank at the end of another busy year, however special mention must be made of Allan Phelps for prudent management of our scarce funds; Judy Wilson for production of the Chronicle; Reggie Crane for Meeting Place management; Sue Carter for her leadership of the Management Committee; Tin Hta Nu for keeping the Global Food Garden lush and growing; Michelle Lopert for Bookends and of course the many volunteers working in the

office, the garden, the Cafe and the Centre generally - where would we be without your passion for the Kendall Community Centre?

We have good relationships with our local State member and Port Macquarie Hastings Council, particularly Mayor Peter Besseling. We nurture those relationships and it does pay dividends. Because of our good relationship with Council we were confident to discuss our wish for the land between the Centre and Bookends remaining in Council ownership, trusting that no action would be taken to change that status without reference and discussion with the Trust. Thanks to everyone for their contribution to Kendall Community Centre and residents of Kendall District.

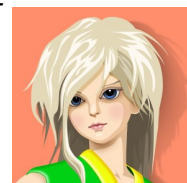
You don't have to be a 'dog' person to appreciate this story.....

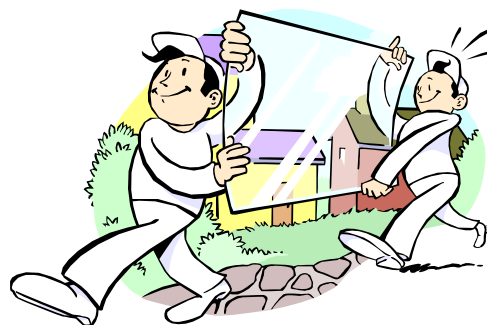

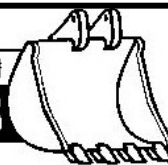

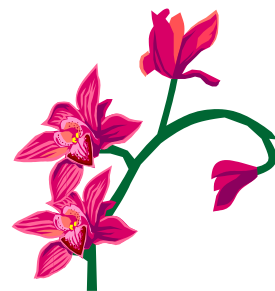

Safe travels and best wishes were extended to John Carter who will be visiting an international orchid conference in Brazil next month.

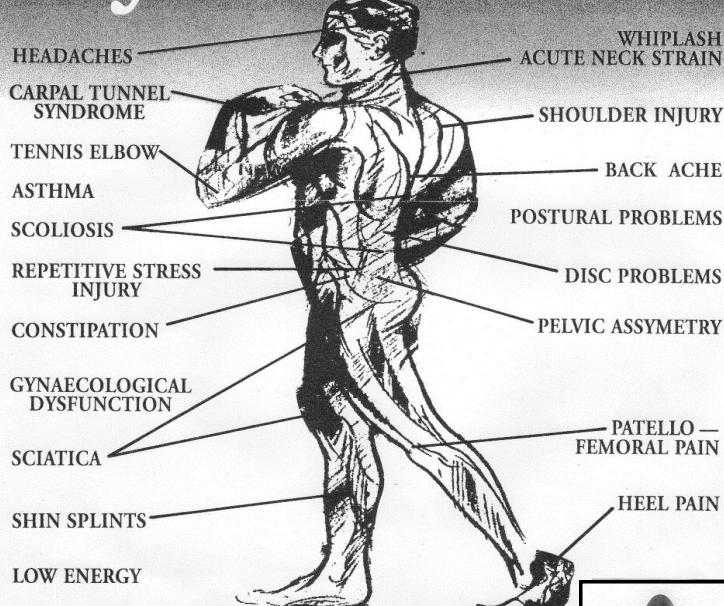
