



## LOCAL 'HEROES'

Col and Kathy Mangan are long-term Volunteers in the Lorne Rural Fire Brigade. Elected by their peers, they are both Deputy Captains (Col is Senior DC) which permits them to take a fire truck and crew to incidents like grass, bush or forest fires, motor vehicle accidents etc and to conduct Controlled Burns for Hazard Reduction.

Kathy and Col both work for Coles; Kathy at the Lighthouse Beach store and Col in Laurieton. To celebrate its centenary Coles has recently run a "Community Heroes" event where their employees were invited to give a speech to judges on a topic which suits that title. Both Col and Kathy entered, and both won the heat at their own store. Advanced to the Zone level, the judges were unable to separate them - they were awarded Joint First prize and so proceeded to the State finals.

Col spoke on how he became involved 21 years ago, in the Brigade, what they've done fundraising to extend the shed and improve the Service, incidents attended, training received and given etc - all sound information of his involvement as Captain and as Deputy. Kathy joined him in the Brigade 17 years ago. Her talk was also on the RFB with her involvement including Community Engagement especially at schools teaching the fire safety message of 'Get low and Go'. When Kathy joined, the attitude towards females in the once (still?) misogynistic and blokey Rural Fire Service was - *'Females: Admin and tea-making OK, but an Active Fire Fighter - no way'*. She proudly said it has been changed somewhat by her conduct and dedication. Included in her talk was the description of one major fire where she arrived with an all female crew much to the surprise of the Incident Controller. The 'girls' of course acquitted themselves well and were grudgingly praised when stood down from active duty at the end of their shift. Her trail-blazing has opened the male minds and prompted many females to become firefighters - most Brigades now have a few, all just as capable as the males, (often more so!).

The state contest was of course held in Sydney. When the flight Col and Kathy had actually boarded was cancelled due to technical problems, it was drive down or abandon their quest. They drove to Berowra, train in, returning same day same way. The speeches and judging proceeded with Kathy and Col being awarded Runners-up: I'm sure that the drive down did not help their confidence and concentration at the event. Their prizes include paid leave (40 hrs each) to attend Section 44 fires (the major ones run by Head Office or their Deputies) or large Emergencies in our local area where a schedule of Brigade attendances is made up.



We congratulate Col and Kathy on their status as Second in the State as Coles 'Community Heroes' and wish them many more years fighting *and beating* fires. May we suggest that next time you see Kathy or Col at their place of work or in Kendall Club or wherever, that you congratulate (and embarrass) them for their success, and their dedication to protecting us all.

## CWA of NSW: Advocates for Change

The CWA of NSW will celebrate its Awareness Week this year by continuing to advocate for change on issues they believe are important to rural and regional families.

Awareness Week 2014 runs from 6 September to 13 September 2014 and in Kendall will be celebrated with an *information stall at Woolworths, Lakewood on the 12th September from 9am to 12midday.*

Every year the CWA of NSW raises money, makes donations and calls for change to improve the lives of regional and rural women and families. In 2014 alone the CWA of NSW has donated more than \$70,000 to disaster relief, provided 59 education grants to rural students and lobbied the government to ban the sale of energy drinks to minors.

The CWA of NSW has now partnered with Work Cover NSW to raise awareness of the health and safety risks associated with working and living on a farm.

"Working on a farm presents many unique risks and safety concerns," says *Diane Davis, Secretary, Kendall Branch of the CWA of NSW.* "By helping to communicate these risks during our Awareness Week we hope to minimise the rate of injury which will improve life for rural communities.

In the last three years almost 5,500 NSW farmers have been injured at work and had to claim workers compensation.

"As we know, when a farmer is injured or sick and can't work it affects the whole family," said *Diane.* "This is an important issue and we are encouraging all farming families to go to [www.aliveandwell.net.au](http://www.aliveandwell.net.au) to access resources or to tell their story about safety on the farm – this might just help someone else."

The CWA of NSW is also using Awareness Week to call on the politicians to urgently investigate the contraction of Lyme disease in Australia.

Sunday 3 August was a tough day of competition at the Sydney Conservatorium as 8 semi-finalists battled for one of four invitations to the Kendall National Violin Competition (KNVC) finals.

The usual high standard of performance was maintained and in fact any combination of the semi-finalists would have been worthy to perform in the finals.

In fact only four could be chosen and the semi-final judging panel of **Alice Waten, Ole Bohn and Carl Pini** selected **Tiffany Cheng, Yejin Min, Josephine Chung and Rollin Zhao** to advance to the KNVC finals which will be held in Kendall on Saturday 13 September, with a Celebratory Concert, featuring the 2014 KNVC winner, on Sunday 14 September.

There was no doubt that audience selections ranged over all semi-finalists which indicated both the high quality field and the range of approaches on offer by the performers.

The prize for the 2014 winner is a **Caldersmith concert violin** which is being described as amongst Graham's finest to date. **Ross Dickson, Chief Forester, represented the main sponsor Forestry Corporation NSW**, who noted the connections between fine wood and excellence in performance that link this competition and forestry, as exemplified by the township of Kendall.

### NEW BENCH IN PLACE

You might have noticed a new bench has been placed in the Henry Kendall Park (opposite the Club) recently in memory of Dorothy Hope.

Not everyone would be aware of who Dorothy was. Dorothy was a local potter, living at the time, in Port Macquarie with husband Jack and conducting many workshops at her property called Thrumster along the old Oxley Highway. Dorothy and Jack loved to visit their friends in Comboyne and it was with this union that Henry Kendall Park was instigated.

The artwork and tiles displayed, all Dorothy's work, were inspired by the history involved in the shaping of Kendall and her love of the area. Dorothy had a passion for her work and was an icon in her field. One of Dorothy's artworks hangs today in the Glasshouse in Port Macquarie, a huge mural of Port Macquarie which was originally made to adorn the wall of the Council building which was demolished to make way for the Glasshouse.

The mural was painstakingly removed from the old wall before being demolished but unfortunately many tiles were broken, so what now hangs is a cryptic version.

With the placing of the new bench, Dorothy's works will be enjoyed for many more years by young and old. Missed everyday 15/5/17 - 11/9/13.



# KENDALL DISTRICT GARDENERS CLUB



The meeting commenced with a discussion on the use of the recycling, vegetation and rubbish bins and the changes being introduced from 1<sup>st</sup> September.

Two prizes were available for this month – Bamboo and handcrafted cards.

Wauchope Garden Club has invited some representation from Kendall to attend their Friendship day on 28<sup>th</sup> August.

The members' phone list will be updated and members were asked to check that their details were correct.

There will be garden displays at the Comboyne Village Fair to be held on Sunday 14<sup>th</sup> September.

It was mentioned that the walk to Diamond Head is particularly worthwhile at present as there is a good show of wild flowers and banksias.

The guest speaker this month was Debbie Mulligan who had more than 40 years horticultural experience. She talked about caring for Stone Fruit Trees. She suggested a number of companion plants to help combat pests.

Garlic and chives would repel insect pests.

Comfrey will attract slugs into traps.

Lavender was good for discouraging codling moth.

Tansy was good for repelling flying insects and adding potassium to the soil.

Clover helped with providing nitrogen.

Leeks and onions reduced the incidence of cut worms.

Marigolds and salvias attracted bees.

To control fungus use a good fungicide. Need to be vigilant and check at bud opening and when the tree is dormant.

Pruning requires the practice of good hygiene, good stock, sharp equipment and the cleaning of the open wound. Tea Tree oil is a good disinfectant.


Feed the trees with compost, cow manure and blood and bone.

John presented Debbie with a thank-you certificate. A special thanks was given to the morning tea providers and to all who helped with this meeting.
