
we will have the pleasure of hearing DAVID SMITH from Port Macquarie as the main guest artist..

Kendall CWA By Gael Mackenzie



Kendall District Gardeners Club By Jim Lewin

This month Doug Pope hosted the meeting as John is away. Doug welcomed everyone and commented on the refreshing rain. Next month Ron Chapman will be talking on how to present flowers cut or potted, for showing. Please bring in at least two samples of cut/potted flowers.

Some of our members attended the Wauchope Garden Friendship day. The speakers were entertaining and interesting. A lovely lunch was provided as well as lucky door prizes. Some upcoming events were announced – Port Macquarie Open Gardens, Plant Lovers Fair, Kendall Community Boatshed BBQ at Bunnings. Doug also discussed an article in "Gardening Australia" about using potatoes as clay busters.

Show and tell led to a discussion about weeds.

The guest speaker was Elke Knabel on the subject of Soil Chemistry.

Water should compose 25% of the soil. It is essential to allow fertilizers to be delivered to plants. There is lots of bioactivity in the water. Original hydroponics used only chemicals and water. It was learned that the bio-organisms were required to be added to enable good plant growth. Aquaponics using fish to deliver the micro-organisms was later developed to overcome this.


Soils are graded from finest particles to largest as clay, silt, sand and gravel. Fertilizer tends to attach to clay. Most activity occurs in the first 30cm of soil. The most important part is the organic part. Mulching is important to retain moisture and to add organic nutrients to the soil. Compaction causes water logging which can be resolved though mechanical aeration or using plants such as tillage radishes to break up the soil. Worms are important as they also help aerate and distribute organic matter through the soil. There is not much carbon in Australian soil.


Doug thanked Elke for her presentation. He also thanked all who helped with today's meeting.


