Appeal for information following robbery

Police are appealing for information and dashcam footage following an alleged armed robbery on the state's Mid North Coast. **About 10.25pm Saturday 20th January 2024**, emergency services were called to a licensed premises on Ocean Drive, Kew, following reports of an armed robbery.

Officers attached to Mid North Coast Police District were told three males had threatened staff before leaving with cash. The males were described as wearing face coverings and dark clothing.

Police established a crime scene and commenced an investigation into the incident.

As inquiries continue, police are appealing for anyone with information or dashcam footage to contact Mid North Coast police, or Crime Stoppers on 1800 333 000 and at <https://nsw.crimestoppers.com.au> or Police Assistance Line on 131 444.

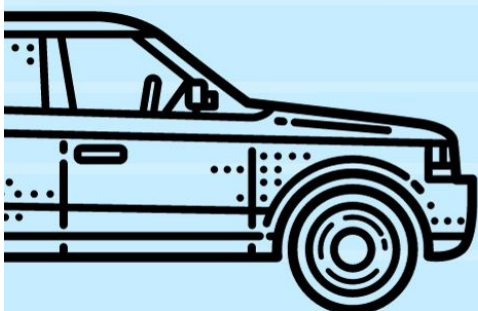

How to keep your myGov account safe

There are some simple things you can do to help protect your myGov account.

Here are my top five tips:

1. Your sign in details are the first line of defense to your myGov account – don't share them with anyone. I'd also recommend signing in to myGov using your myGov username rather than your email or phone number. You can change this in your account settings.
2. Use a strong, unique password or passphrase that isn't used anywhere else – the longer it is the stronger it is.
3. Be scam aware – myGov won't send you a text message or email with a hyperlink asking you to sign in or share personal information.
4. To use myGov, always type my.gov.au into your internet browser or download and use the official myGov app.
5. To increase the security on your myGov account, choose to get a code by SMS or use the myGov Code Generator app as your second sign in option.

If you've clicked on a suspicious link or given your personal information to a scammer, and you're worried someone may try to access your myGov account, call our Scams and Identity Theft Helpdesk on 1800 941 126.

The helpdesk can check your records for suspicious activity and add security measures to prevent unauthorised access.

We can also refer you to IDCARE (phone 1800 595 160), which provides a range of support for people affected by scams and identity theft.

Services Australia takes cybersecurity very seriously and has robust protections in place on its systems, including myGov. This includes monitoring and fraud detection systems to protect customers. We review and take down all fake myGov scams sites that get reported to ...

The picnic table is used by many as a rest stop or morning tea break for the walking groups. At the moment it is not safe to use but I currently have plans to repair the table, just waiting on the timber.



On Sunday, 3rd March at 2 pm the Kendall National Violin Competition welcomes home to Kendall the amazing violinist Victoria Wong (Finalist 2011 and Bach Prize Winner) and internationally acclaimed young concert artist Marcel Mok. Together these exciting young concert artists perform a program of romantic masterpieces by Schubert, Clara Schumann, Franck and Tchaikovsky. Praised in Germany for her „technically flawless playing“ and her „refined playful sensuousness“ Victoria Wong is currently one of the finest musicians of her generation. She has been a winner and prize-winner of numerous international competitions and has performed as soloist in important European Concert halls. She has been guest concertmaster with orchestras such as the Berliner Symphoniker, Deutsche Oper Berlin and the Sinfonisches Kammerorchester Berlin and performs regularly with the Berlin Philharmonic. 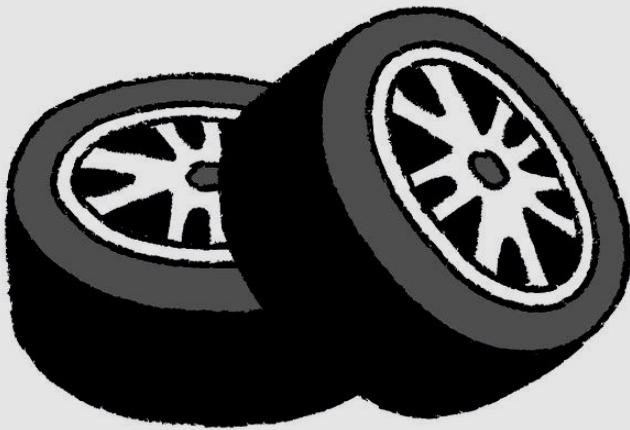

Recipe of the Month ...

... Baked Chicken & Tomato Parcels

These chicken and tomato parcels cook in just 30 minutes.

Baking the chicken in paper, known as 'en papillote', ensures that the flavours are retained and the meat remains tender and juicy. Serves: 4

Ingredients

4 chicken breast fillets
1 handful fresh chopped parsley
1 tablespoon of rosemary, thyme or oregano
4 cloves garlic, thinly sliced
2 tablespoons olive oil
200g cherry tomatoes



Method

Preheat oven to 180°C and cut four pieces of baking paper approximately 30cm square. Fold each one in half to mark the centre and reopen.

Season the chicken breasts to taste and sprinkle the parsley. Place one on each sheet of paper to one side of the seam. Gently sauté the herbs and garlic in the oil. Once the garlic has browned, add the tomatoes and cook until around half have popped. Divide the mixture between the four chicken breasts.

Fold the paper into a parcel, tight enough that the juices don't escape, but also ensuring that the steam can be released.

Place the parcels on a baking tray and cook for about 20 minutes. Remove from the oven and leave to rest for five minutes. Serve the parcel unopened with a green salad and some crusty bread.

Kendall Community Garden

As if the Gardening Crew Weren't Saucy Enough, Summer Toms Produce the Good Stuff!

Summer has seen good growth in the Community Global Food Garden, with seasonal varieties producing fruit which will soon be ready for harvest such as limes and cucumbers.

Although spasmodic rainfall has encouraged some disease in local tomatoes, the periods of hot, dry weather have allowed for a good harvest. We have found that the two-tone 'Black Russian' variety (pictured) better withstood disease and produced more fruit than the two other varieties grown this season.

With a surfeit of tomatoes this year, we thought it might be useful to share our favourite way of using up these delicious toms when they all ripen at the same time- tomato sauce!

For every kilo of ripe tomatoes we add one large chopped onion, a cup of vinegar, 125g of sugar and a teaspoon of table salt in a large pot. This all gets boiled, stirred occasionally, and strained after 2 hours. The strained sauce gets returned to the pot and reduced for about another hour or until thickened to your liking. If you put it in a sterilised jar, it can last for up to

12 months (recipe courtesy of the "Self Sufficient Me" YouTube channel).

You will be amazed at the difference in flavour from your own vine-ripened tomatoes- you can practically taste the sunshine! We recommend serving with hot chips and scallops from Kendall Takeaway or with a dog's eye/ banger sanger for the patriotic crowd on Australia Day.

We hope to see any interested locals for working bees, or to pick up some sunny summer produce, Thursdays from around 9am.

BRING BACK TO SCHOOL VOUCHERS BACK



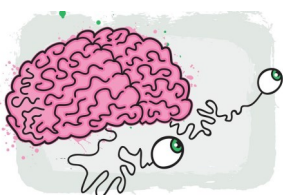

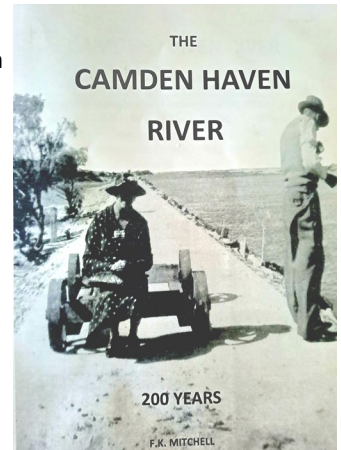
LOCAL HISTORY

Do you know what to do if you see a koala in the wild in the local area?

There are some really simple steps-

 If they are up a tree or in a safe area living their best life, simply log that you

have spotted them on our website via the report a sighting button at the top of the home page. This information is recorded and helps inform decisions made about koalas and their habitats.

 **If you see a koala and it looks unwell or is in an unsafe location, please call the Koala Hospital on 6584 1522 and speak to one of our volunteers.**

They will ask you some **questions** like:

- * What is your name and location you are calling from?
- * Is the koala in an unsafe location. eg.

KOALA HOSPITAL

PORT MACQUARIE

in a backyard with dogs?

- * Does the koala they look like they have a dark stain on their bottoms?
- * If they are up a tree, how far up do you think they are?

All of these questions help inform our team to make a decision as to if it is logged as a sighting or we send in the rescue crew!



SNAKES

If you see a snake, please keep your distance, do not try to touch it or try to contain it.

Snakes are very common particularly in summer and will regularly be seen around houses and yards. They are usually passing through and will be gone within a few hours. Keeping your lawn short and yard free of debris will reduce the likelihood of snakes in your yard.

If you stay well away from the snake it presents no immediate danger.

While many snakes are not venomous please keep children

and pets away from snakes at all times.

If you find a snake in your house, please make sure all people, children and pets are moved into other rooms and kept away until the situation is resolved. If you can safely do so, isolate the snake in the room you found it by closing the doors to the room and putting towels along the bottom of the doors. **Call WIRES Rescue Line on 1300 094 737 or fill in the Rescue Form for rescue assistance. Do not approach the snake or try to contain it yourself.**

If you've found a snake in your yard:

Snakes are normally only passing through a yard when they are sighted. Following all the steps above you can monitor the snake from a safe distance and they will usually move on within a few hours.

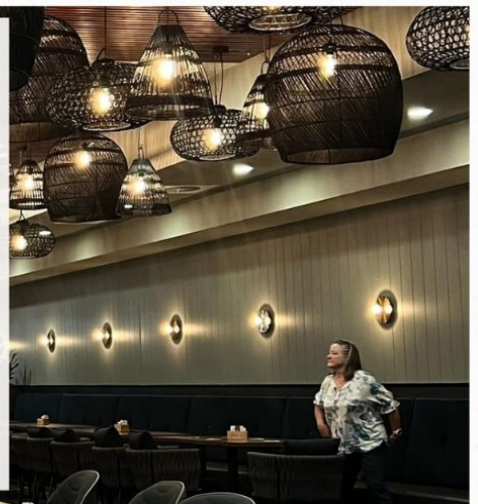
