### **Recipe of the Month ...** Garlic prawns with steamed rice


#### **Ingredients**

- 1 cup (200g) white long-grain rice
- 1 kilogram uncooked king prawns
- 4 cloves garlic, crushed
- 1/2 cup (125ml) dry white wine
- 1 1/4 cup (310ml) pouring cream
- 1/4 cup fresh chives, finely chopped

#### Method

 Rinse rice in strainer under cold running water until water runs clear, drain. Place rice in medium saucepan with 1 cup water, cover, bring to the boil then simmer about 8 minutes or until rice is tender. Stand, covered, 3 minutes,

- then fluff rice with fork.
- 2. Meanwhile, shell and devein prawns, leaving tails intact.
- 3. Heat oiled large



- 4. Add cream to pan, simmer, uncovered, until mixture is thickened slightly. Season to taste.
- 5. Sprinkle prawn mixture with chives, serve with rice.

### Kendall Community Global Food Garden

With some rain and plenty of warm sunshine, the Global Food Garden is definitely flourishing!

The bee-loving roses are especially beautiful this season. The snake beans are slowly but surely climbing their trellis and the Balinese corn is now waist-high. As an experiment in companion planting, we plan to encourage the yellow climbing beans to grow up the corn stalks. In return the beans provide some ground cover to keep the soil around the corn cool.

A common problem in the garden are the slugs and the snails. They love to chomp on tender little seedlings and other plants which can be quite disheartening! We have found that placing beer in little cups around the garden works quite well to reduce the pests. They are attracted to the yeasty smell of the beer and they drown in it (happily I hope!)

However, the problem has always been, who wants to waste their beer on slugs? Well, last week Maryanne and Steve arrived at the garden with a crate load of thoroughly undrinkable homemade beer - for the slugs! Problem solved!



So many roses ... particularly two beautiful ones!!

Or so we thought ... it turns out that slugs are surprisingly discerning - they didn't like it either - they wouldn't go near it! We are now working on the idea of a foliar spray, a slug repellent ... stay tuned!

Then, on New Year's Eve, empty it and see what awesome stuff happened this year.








