Congratulations to Tin - Kendall's Living Treasure!



Tin Hta Nu, a political refugee who fled Myanmar (Burma) in 1990 after her commitments to human rights during her university days meant her life was in danger, was awarded the Living Treasure Award (formerly Senior Citizen of the Year) at the recent Australia Day Awards.

"Australia saved my life, given me a place to stay, so I would like to give back knowledge and services in appreciation"

Living to this promise, some of Tin's achievements include: she established the Kendall-Kadaw friendship School project.; a volunteer at the Kendall Community Op Shop, Kendall CWA, and Kendall Garden Club; a Founding member of Kendall Community Centre's The Meeting Place Cafe, and initiating the Kendall Global Food Community Garden at the Centre. For many years she taught Burmese language, Asian and Middle East cooking at the Community Colleges.

In 2010 she initiated the Mid North Coast Refugee Support Group (MNCRSG).

The values she developed in Burma of going out of your way to help someone else and the importance of community

has guided Tin to encourage people to work together for the greater good of others.

The 2023 Port Macquarie-Hastings Australia Day Award recipients were announced, on Thursday 26th January at the event at The Glasshouse, recognising dedicated people in the community for their efforts in cultural, environmental and social progress.

Mayor Peta Pinson congratulated the recipients, saying their contributions exemplify Australian values – and the spirit of the Port Macquarie Hastings region.

"This year we received some outstanding nominations in the five award categories: the Environment Award, Community Organisation of the Year, Young Leader of the Year, Living Treasure and Citizen of the Year.

"I want to take this opportunity to commend all of our nominees and congratulate all of the winners who have shone so brightly during 2022.

"It is through your compassion and determination that you make our community a better place to live, work and play."

Kendall School of Arts set for final showdown of the 22nd Kendall National Violin Competition

Kendall School of Arts will be the venue to showcase seven brilliant young Australian violinists on the weekend of 4th and 5th March. Following a hotly contested semi-final round at the Sydney Conservatorium shortly before Christmas last year, the competition now moves to its final stage in Kendall where prizes and winners are going to be determined.

The Kendall National Violin Competition, a unique national event of its kind, will award a concert violin made by master luthier Michal Prokop to one of its winners. With all finalists guaranteed to receive sizeable prizes, the winner of the senior section of the violin competition receives a prize of \$ 8,500 and for the first time in 2023, will be invited to participate and perform in the prestigious Erben Music Festival in Munich, Germany following their success.

Founded in 1999 by visionary Australian violin maker Graham Caldersmith and the competition's artistic director, Goetz Richter, the Kendall National Violin Competition has brought exceptional musical talent and ideas to Kendall for over two decades and has promoted the village of Kendall around the world. Winners and finalists of the competition have successful international careers.


In addition to presenting a major musical competition every second year in Kendall, the Kendall Violin Competition also presents a regular series of four PhiloMusica concerts throughout the year at the School of Arts, exploring the synergy between ideas of music and philosophy in Kendall and reaches out to local schools for educational visits and musical performances supported by the Kendall Op Shop. The international reach of the Kendall Violin Competition will be extended following the finals in 2023 with a project to acquire a violin from a major European maker as a prize instrument.

The weekend of performances feature finalists in category B (musicians born after 1st January 1997 and before 1st January 2005) on Saturday 4th March commencing at 3pm. Violinists David Carreon, Beatrice Colombis, Jimmy Park and Andrew Wang will be supported by pianists Jeanell Carrigan and Alexander Yau for their final performances. On Sunday,



5th March, violinists Hannah Kim, Jessica Ma and Ein Na will perform concertos with a string ensemble and virtuosic works to determine the prizes in category A (violinists born after 1st January 2004) at 11 am at the Kendall School of Arts. The performance on Saturday 4th March will also feature a new composition by young Australian Composer Tim Doubinski, winner of the Kendall National Violin Competition's Watermark Prize. The weekend of performances by finalists will conclude with performance by all violinists in a celebration concert on Sunday, 5th March at 2.30 pm. On Monday, 6th March, musicians of the Festival Final will present performances for local schools.

Kendall District Garden Club News by Jim Leewin

(Patrons: Christine and Richard Cullen)

John welcomed everyone and reminded people to sign in and wear their badges. He thanked all those who contributed food and lucky door prizes for the Christmas Party last month. There is a range of items for this month's prizes. There were some give aways - cucumbers, strawberry runners, dwarf butterbean seeds, and laminated leaves to use as bookmarks.

John circulated one of the world's smallest orchids for people to view. It had tiny flowers and is sensitive to humidity. There was a box of magazines for members to take. The price of fertilizers was discussed, and it was agreed to keep the bigger bags at \$3 a bag.

A question was asked about why cucumbers were not producing fruit even though there were lots of flowers. It can happen the male and female flowers may appear at different time and therefore not fertilizing. It was suggested the male flowers be cut off and kept in the fridge and used to pollinate the female flowers if the sequence was right. It was also suggested to keep plenty of water up to the plants.

The speakers at this meeting were Peter and Elizabeth Versluis who advised about health and safety in the garden. Peter showed us how and when to use a defibrillator, that is when the person is unconscious, not breathing and no pulse. He demonstrated the recovery position, advised us how to treat snake and spider bites and various aquatic stings.

Lacerations are common in the garden requiring pressure to be put on the wounds. Ensure that your tetanus shot is up to date. A booster is required every 10 years.

Wear a mask when using potting mix to prevent bacteria getting into your lungs possibly causing legionnaires disease.

Be aware that you can get dehydrated. If you stop sweating or have a dry mouth you are probably dehydrated.




Peter demonstrating CPR and defibrillator.





Recipe of the Month ... Salmon with Mango Chutney

With a good dose of healthy omega-3 fats, Salmon with Mango Chutney will ensure that your health and your tastebuds are in for a treat. Serves 2.

Ingredients

- O 1/3 cup orange juice
- O 1 tablespoon finely minced ginger
- O 2 teaspoon olive oil
- O 2 teaspoon soy sauce
- o 2 salmon fillets
- O 2 tablespoons hot mango chutney
- O 1 tablespoon orange juice

Method

In shallow bowl, mix 1/3 cup orange juice, ginger, oil and soy sauce, and then completely coat the salmon fillets with mixture. Leave in refrigerator to marinate for four hours.



In a small saucepan over low heat, add the chutney and one tablespoon of orange juice, and heat until the chutney dissolves.

Preheat oven to 190°C and lightly grease a baking sheet with olive oil. Place salmon fillets on the baking sheet and brush with the chutney mixture. Bake for 10 minutes until the fillets are cooked. Serve with a fresh side salad.


