The Minister for Active Transport Rob Stokes recently visited the Port Macquarie electorate and Leslie Williams, Member for Port Macquarie, organised a meeting with some Kendall and Kew locals to talk about future stages of the Schools to School Pathway Project.

This community led initiative has previously received funding support from the NSW Government and Leslie will be advocating for more funds to ensure the vital link between Kew and Kendall is progressed.

Kendall Community Op Shop was established in 1995 to raise funds to help build the Kendall Swimming pool. After the ing back to the community: get an "Expression of interest" pool opened in 2004, funds were channelled into building and then extending a new shop and since 2009 profits are returned to the community via a grants system.

#### IT IS THE ONCE-A-YEAR GRANTS TIME AGAIN AT THE OPSHOP

Thursday 23rd March 2023, starting at 6 pm is the Op **Shop Grants Presentation Night at the Kendall Services &** Citizens Club.

The Grants system aims to assist non-profit community groups and organisations that are interested in and working toward the enhancements and wellbeing of the residents of Kendall and district. Each year Community groups apply for funds of up to \$20,000. In addition, funds are directed to oneoff projects and sponsorships. 15% of annual net profits have been donated to local and overseas charities.

The shop is staffed by a team of around 85 volunteers who work morning or afternoon shifts. Two shop coordinators oversee the coordination of shifts and the general organisation and running of the shop. Volunteers are encouraged to use their skills and interests during their shift and many help coordinate an area of responsibility within the shop. The shop is under the management of a committee who work to ensure the effective running of the shop. Volunteers and community members are very proud of our shop and what it has achieved both in the past and for the future.

Displays are showing a coffee machine making and barista's equipment followed by Friday, 17th March 2023 planned for the St Patricks Day Display which then will change to the 'Easter Bunny's' Display for the Easter weekend from Friday 7th - Monday 10th April which is the start into the school holidays as well.

The OpShop will be closed on Good Friday, Easter Saturday and also Easter Monday (Friday 7th to Monday 10th April 2023 closed).

Planning ahead, save on cost of living, make your dollar go further, spend it on food instead.

Hot-hot-hot: The summer clothes (all toddlers/children, school uniforms, ladies', men's) sale of 50 % already started and will keep going until end of March 2023 or longer, so will the half-price sale for ladies/men/children/toddlers shoes keep an eye on our Facebook page which will keep up-todate with dates and sales.

Choose to challenge yourself: shop 2<sup>nd</sup> hand then you don't feel guilty filling your wardrobe with new purchases!

Note that rags sold in large bags for \$15 or small bags for \$8 are always a good source for 'keeping hands clean', helps recycling and is commendable when local businesses are able to support the community as two dedicated volunteers provide good quality cut up material.



Trade at Coopernook Pub was boosted as others joined us for lunch. The staff did a great job and we enjoyed delicious food in the shady outdoor setting.



It was so great to show and educate these kiddos on some of the different fruit trees and veggies we grow. We really want to pro-
