Grants Night of Kendall Community Op Shop

Kendall Community Op Shop held its 15th Annual Grants Presentation at 6pm on Thursday, 23rd March 2023 at the Kendall Services and Citizens Club, Kendall.

This all important and wonderful event has only possible because of all the 90 volunteers' endless efforts, their time and committed support of the Op Shop's aim to raise and distribute money for the community.

It makes the volunteers proud for being part of the Kendall Op Shop's team!

After welcoming everyone to the presentation, Phillip Higgins, Chairperson of the Op Shop Grants Sub Committee introduced Leslie Williams, Member for Port Macquarie.

Ms Williams thanked everyone involved in the Op Shop, and also the community groups present, saying that Kendall is indeed an incredible community with outstanding volunteer involvement. Phil also welcomed guest presenter Cameron Marshall, breakfast radio presenter at ABC Mid North Coast Radio.

An overview of the history of the Kendall Op Shop and its Fund Distribution was presented by Phil.

The shop was first opened in 1995 and was run under the name of The Kendall Pool Committee for the purpose of raising funds towards the construction of the Kendall Community Pool and in 2004 -2020, the shop contributed \$640,727 toward the total cost of the pool and another \$211,422 towards improvements including PA System, Pool Heating, Lane Ropes, Shade Shelters and Wheelchair access.

It is.. the "Best resourced Community Pool in the Port Macquarie/Hastings area!" exclaimed Phil.

In 2008, the shop became known as the Kendall Community Op Shop, and the constitution was amended to allow the shop to apply funds to projects in the areas of Sport and recreation and Arts and Culture, and to assist with the funding of major community projects. As well the shop was able to distribute funds to local Charities, to a total of 5% of its annual net profits. In 2023, this amount has been increased to 15%.



In 2009 a Grants Programme was introduced and up to 2023 a Grand Total of \$1,530,043 has been distributed by the Kendall Community Op Shop over the past 15 years.

Schools Programme.. Grants Sub Committee member Diane Pope described a new initiative of the Op Shop where eight local schools have been allocated \$3,000 each for the year, to be used to assist students who may otherwise not be able to join in on extra activities offered or involved in by their school due to financial constraints. These funds are to be made available on a needs basis, throughout the year. The programme to date has been very well received. Total of Schools programme \$24,000.

22nd Kendall National Violin Competition decides winners & awards prizes!

Following a weekend of stellar performances from some of Australia's most promising violinists at the Kendall School of Arts two winners were identified by a jury of three national experts.

The competition was held in two categories and reached its climax in Kendall on March 4 and 5 in front of a captivated audience. Seven prizes were awarded in total including a first prize of a concert violin made by master luthier Michal Prokop from Australian timbers bequeathed to him by the late Graham Caldersmith OAM.

Goetz Richter, Artistic Director of the competition, collected the violin in Cambridge, UK and brought it to Kendall days before the finals of the competition, an event widely reported by the ABC. "The two winners this year, young violinist Ein Na from Brisbane (Category A) and Beatrice Colombis from Sydney are truly exceptional musicians and charismatic virtuosi who really make their audiences listen." Richter said. "It is amazing how the Kendall National Violin Competition has established itself as a major artistic event in Australia receiving plenty of international attention as well through its alumni and friends everywhere."

The competition proceeded through three rounds with semi-final performances in Sydney in December 2022 providing the launching pad for the ultimate performance in Kendall. The recitals of the finalists in category B also featured premier performances of the Sonata No 1 (*Temperamental*) by Tim Doubinski, winner of the competition's *Watermark 2022 Composition Prize* which was a compulsory work all finalists in that category had to perform. Finalists in category A performed a concerto with string orchestra.

The ensemble also gave educational performances for the Kendall Primary School, the Kendall Community Pre-school

and the Herons Creek Public School on March 6 to the delight of their young audiences.

These visits to local schools are partially supported by the Kendall Community Op Shop with plans by the Kendall National Violin Competition to expand their reach.

This ANZAC Day we commemorate the 108th Anniversary of the landing on the beaches of Gallipoli by the Australian and New Zealand Army Corps, at dawn on this very day ... 25th April 1915.



Camden Haven Rural Fire Brigade

Over the coming months the Camden Haven Rural Fire Brigade will be reaching out to the residents of our area for your assistance in helping us identify water sources.

As part of their commitment to you to assist with fire protection during time of fire danger, they carry out training and community engagement to insure we can give the best cover possible.

Water is the most important resource they have to combat fire and to have the ability to know where it is and to have access to it in a timely matter.

They ask you, as residents of the Camden Haven Rural Fire Brigade area, to assist us identifying water supply that are suitable for our firefighting should the need arise in your area.

To do this we have a Static Water Supply (SWS) program. The SWS Program is a free service that enables residents to help local firefighters by identifying existing water supplies (such as dams, tanks or swimming pools with more than 3,000 litre capacity) on their property that could be used for firefighting purposes.

After you contact them, they will conduct an inspection to make sure the firefighting team have all weather access for a large tanker (Category 1 appliance) to your supply and then they issue you with the SWS plaque for you to display on your gate post.

They also carry out property inspections and advise you on how to prepare your property ready for the fire season. Remember a well prepared property stands a better chance of surviving a bush fire.

Food Garden

As we come out of Summer into Autumn, it is time to plant our Winter vegetables.

Whether you are Vegan, Vegetarian, or Paleo, herbs provide flavourful ways to enhance any dish.

In our garden we have Chives, Parsley, Basil, Thyme, Rosemary, and Oregano, along with Lemongrass and Mint for making tea.

Basil Pesto

Ingredients:

2 cups of fresh basil leaves 14 cup of chives 2 tablespoons of infused olive oil



~ Writer's Corner ~

'Diary of a different Outback Adventure'

I began this on 30th October 2022.

Bob and I volunteer at Trilby Station, Louth NSW, a 320,000 acre sheep station that opens its property to travellers so they can experience life in the outback; we have been doing this for a number of years now.. On our first visit Bob was able to paddle a canoe on the Darling River; the next visit the Darling was just big puddles and the station was struggling with drought. What a barren outlook. The family has worked this property for generations – the good times and the bad – they just keep going.

Well ... that was until the Darling River began to carry all this water down from the northern rains. We made the commitment to stay.

Here we are now, river rising daily, cut off in all directions - we are literally on an island in the outback!

The family are working their sheep station every day, then coming back to the homestead area and moving earth to close up the levee to protect the homestead area. (Station is now closed to all visitors)

Bob and I were raised in country areas (WA and NSW) – we know country life – both of us now in our 70's and this is a new experience. It's a little frightening, our ute and van could be damaged – water (and fire) are very destructive.

As I write this, I can hear the big machinery moving the dirt; today the river is at 12.6 metres; they predict 13.5 metres; and the levee is supposed to hold back 14 metres!

If the airstrip begins to go under, the planes will be moved over to the eastern side of the river and be accessed by the 'tinnie'.

At the moment I don't know how I feel – this is so different for us! We are seeing more lizards and snakes along with wild pigs and a family of 'roos' on this 'island' with us. We potter along doing our daily chores watching the river rise and are coming to the conclusion that we may be spending Christmas on this island.

We have lived in Lorne for well over 20 years and for the last four years our daughter and her kids have resided here with us, so for now we have a built-in house sitter while we do our outback thing.

It's now 1st November 2022 and these are the changes so far – the mail is delivered to Louth; someone flies there to get it and also the groceries when ordered online.

A trip to 'town', if those roads are opened, is to fly into Louth (vehicles already there prior to roads being impassable), one and a half to two hours drive, shop, drive one and a half to two hours back, be picked up by plane to fly back to the station.

We have been on the 'island' for some time now; the river continues to rise (now at 12.7 metres); and the family continues to work the station and build the levee. Only way out for us now would be a medical emergency and that's the Royal Flying Doctor. Luckily our contact with this service has been by phone for fairly minor problems – but such an eye opener for us coastal dwellers. Stations have a medical box, locked at all

times with a strict routine for the supply of medicines. SES is now delivering essential to stations by chopper.

It is now 23rd November and the river is at 13.2 metres and still rising. This generous family has given us the choice to go home for Christmas. We will leave the station about 3rd December by 'tinnie' and plane for Bob and me in the mustering chopper, out to the Fees Yards where vehicles and machinery are kept away from the flood plain. There we will have the use of a station ute to drive home (the long, long way – via White Cliffs). The ute and van remain isolated at the homestead island.

Local new reports tell us that many main roads are closed and some accessible with escort only and closed at night. All 26 campsites here (river and billabong) are under water now along with the 10 'drop toilets'. It will be a big clean up once the water recedes – hoping to re-open in March.

I never thought I'd ever see 360 degree water views in the outback. The river reached its peak the day we left at 13.5 metres

The trip home was long and tiring. Seeing the flood from the air was mind-boggling with a flood plain of 100s of kilometres, roads, and bridges all under that water. We had to drive an extra 500kms to get to the Barrier Highway. The trip back was better, most roads were opened, except for the one we wanted so we drove to Louth and AJ flew us back to the station, leaving the ute at the airfield until the roads were opened again; this was 30th December.

During the next two weeks the river dropped dramatically and our next job was put on hold until March, so with the station still closed, not much could be done, we packed up and left the 40+ degree days and headed home on 21st January 2023 – and yes – we go back again to help for five to six weeks at the end of March 2023 – so we are packing again.

Those last three + months have been so different from our usual travels – just a great experience – and so lucky to be with the Murray family who know how to handle what the weather throws at them. Now they need rain to wash the earth. "I love a sunburnt country!"
