Kendall's School of Arts was a buzz with music in June.

On June 4, the Kendall National Violin Competition presented its PhiloMusica concert, featuring the brilliant violinist David Carreon and students from the Sydney Conservatorium. Twice a finalist in the National Violin Competition, David is well known and much loved by Kendall audiences. He was joined in his performance by two emerging artists from the Sydney Conservatorium, Justin Chen (viola) and Joanne Hwang (cello).

Supported wonderfully by pianist Jeanell Carrigan, these stellar young musicians, delighted a substantial and enthusiastic audience. Goetz Richter joined the three young musicians for a performance of Schubert's quartet in a Minor D 804.

Sunday, June 25 featured the inaugural Australian Strings Association (AUSTA) mid North Coast performance Festival at the Kendall School of Arts. Around twenty young string players from the Camden Haven and Hastings area came together to perform for peers, family and Kendall National Violin Competition Artistic Director and Sydney Conservatorium Professor Goetz Richter.

The event supports local talent and teachers and seeks to develop music in the area. Pianist Lydia Wills helped to make all performances a great success and Port Macquarie Violin teachers Natasha Ivanovic (Committee member, Austa NSW) and Lesley Priest (Committee member, Kendall National Violin Competition) were there to support the young musicians and help with organisation. It was a wonderful and inspiring day for the young musicians and their families.

What is the Tax Help program?

The Tax Help program is a free service provided by the Australian Taxation Office designed to help people complete their tax return.

Tax Help is a community of volunteers who provide expertise and advice for those trying to complete their tax returns themselves.

The volunteers don't actually work for the ATO, but are given full training and support.

Tax Help is designed especially to help people on low incomes (less than \$60,000 for the year) or people who would describe themselves as:

- ✓ Seniors
- ✓ Students
- ✓ People from non-English speaking backgrounds
- ✓ People with a disability
- ✓ Aboriginal people and Torres Strait Islanders

Tax Help starts at Kendall Community Centre from Monday 24th July 2023 from 9:30am until the end of October


KENDALL-KEW COMMUNITY NETWORK



Items discussed at the recent meeting held on Thursday 15th June at Kendall S&C Club:

- ◆ Rubbish removal Correspondence with Council June 9 not responded to. No rubbish removed, now largely overgrown.
- ◆ Miss Nellies drain A proposed quote to attend to the problem of \$10,000 rejected by council. A local engineer will inspect and report to the next meeting.
- ◆ **Skate Park** still in the PMH Council hands re community feedback.
- ◆ Logans Crossing Bridge Work has commenced. Pilings may be finished. Hoping for completion in October.
- Kew/Kendall pathway A meeting I scheduled to work with PMH Council re confirmation of Draft Budget including the design. Community consultation to be pursued by Chair Theo. There is recognition for the engineering problems associated with this project.
- ◆ CCAT Meetings Chair Theo has had no call back from Hayley for his request. The CCAT Zoom meeting scheduled for last night was cancelled. Next meeting June 28th.
- Kendall Heritage Society Betty Boyd reported on the demise of the Society.
- Mountain Bike Trail Jason and Chris will give a report at the next meeting on the project to have a Mountain Bike Trail in the local forest.
- ♦ Kew upgrade works Chair Theo has a proposal for a celebration around the completion of Kew roundabout renovations. He called for volunteers to co-ordinate this.
- ♦ Kew Roundabout off the M1 The danger of the south highway exit roundabout was discussed. A proposal for an assembly of locals with a television station exposure of the problem was aired. Barry Barr believes a slower exit speed is needed and a longer approach for the layby itself. The next accident will be the trigger for this community action.
- Delegates representing KKCN Three people are required to become the official delegates from this committee to take specific issues to the council. A letterhead for this committee has been designed.
- Local Brochure The next agenda will discuss a brochure to publicise this group. The website was discussed, knowing the importance of social media for communication.

The next meeting will be held in Kendall Servicemen and Citizen's Club Thursday 10th August at 5.30pm.



Kendall District Garden Club News by Jim Leewin

(Patrons: Christine and Richard Cullen)

John welcomed everyone especially newcomers to the club. John proposed that the club's account at the Bendigo bank be closed, and the funds be transferred to the new Coastline Credit Union account. The motion was seconded by Richard Cullen. A vote was taken, and it was unanimously agreed.

Some giveaway seedlings were available - silver beet and leeks. John showed us a hoya cutting that had been planted upside down causing the new growth to grow out of the bottom of the pot. The use of copper bands on plants to protect them was discussed.

This month Elke Knebel spoke to us about soil health. Elke was involved in setting up the Kendall Community Garden and she studied horticulture. Elke explained about the composition of the soil and how it needs both water and air as well as nutrients for plants to survive.

The type of soil has to be suitable for the plant e.g., sandy, loam or clay. Generally, both sandy and clay soils need an abundance of organic matter added to them. Need to avoid compaction and mulch, mulch, mulch! Check what pH your soil is.

Most Aussie soils are acidic and may need the addition of chemicals to adjust it. However, some plants prefer an acidic soil, so check what you want to grow. Manure and cover crops are good ways of adding nutrients and microbial matter to the soil. A number of questions were asked and answered.

John thanked Elke for her presentation and presented her with a certificate. The raffle was drawn, and five lucky winners claimed their prizes.

Our next meeting is our 19th Birthday Party and there will be a short talk on the benefits of crop rotation. Please bring along some tasty treats to share and there will be some Next meeting will be on 17th July 2023. lucky door prizes.

Nasturtiums, rosemary and tarragon, featured throughout the Global Food Garden, proliferate on commissioned cakes and degustation plates. Whilst ostensibly providing a feast for the beholder, peppery, floral or anise notes may, respectively, also enhance these dishes on the palette.



Their uses as culinary enhancement notwithstanding, we also have flowers that may improve our health. Certainly, lavender's calming properties have been widely observed, with the tea being touted as having sedative and anti-inflammatory properties. Who knew that feverfew, with a few leaves consumed directly (although bitter) can alleviate migraine pain? Or that tarragon flowers (left) can help aid with excessive flatu-

lence? We are happy to be of service to the good ladies of Kendall and provide some of these whenever they are abundant.

Of course, we must not forget that we are also besotted with our flowers for their beauty and romantic connotations.





competitive tennis high schools Toormina and Bonora Point after the boys had a close win over Alstonville High. Great achievement from such a small town and school.



Recipe of the Month ...

Thai Green Curry Meatballs

Ingredients:

1 onion, finely chopped 750g chicken mince 1/2 cup breadcrumbs

1 egg

1/4 cup coriander leaves, chopped

1 & 1/2 tablespoons green curry paste

2 tablespoons olive oil

Sauce ingredients:

2-3 tablespoons green curry paste

1 & 1/2 cups coconut milk

4 lime leaves, shredded

1 & 1/2 tablespoons fish sauce

3 tablespoons sugar

1/2 lime, juiced

Method:

Fry the onion in a little oil until soft. Cool then combine with remaining ingredients (except the oil) and roll into balls, around 5cm in circumference. Refrigerate for 20 minutes. Heat more oil in the frying pan and cook meatballs for about 10 minutes.

To make the sauce, simmer curry paste in a pan for one minute. Stir in coconut milk and lime leaves. Cook for four minutes until the sauce boils. Add fish sauce, sugar and meatballs. Cook for six to eight minutes, then add lime juice. Serve with rice, steamed vegetables or a leafy green salad.
