The Op Shop supports a new project to get the library repaired and functioning. The library is around 65km east of Yangon and countless villages in its neighbourhood plan to make good use of it. Locals and retired academics support the project in many ways, trades people give their talents and are repairing the building including supplying shelves. Donations contribute many books that children, youth and the elderly can borrow and read - a path to keeping informed and literate.





Understanding **LONG COVID**

According to information accessed from the government site, Health Direct, "most people with COVID-19 will recover completely within a few weeks. However, some people may keep experiencing symptoms for several weeks or months after their infection."

People who have a longer recovery period can experience:

- ongoing symptoms in the medium term (from 4 to 12 weeks from first getting COVID-19);
- ♦ longer term symptoms (from 12 weeks or more from first getting COVID-19). This is called 'long COVID' or post COVID -19 condition.

Long COVID can affect nearly all parts of the body with multiple and varied symptoms. These symptoms can be persistent, but come and go over time and have a negative impact on daily life.

These symptoms can include:

- ◆ extreme <u>fatigue</u> (tiredness)
- shortness of breath, heart palpitations, chest pain or tightness
- ♦ cough
- ♦ hoarse voice
- problems with memory and concentration
- changes to taste and smell
- joint and muscle pain
- ♦ problems sleeping
- numbness or pins and needles
- changes in mood (anxiety, depression or stress)
- heart pounding or racing or heart palpitations
- ♦ joint pain
- ♦ muscle pain
- ♦ rash
- ♦ low-grade fever
- reduced appetite and weight loss
- difficulty going about everyday activities, such as work or

Long COVID can also show up as new chronic conditions, such as heart disease, diabetes, kidney disease and neurological conditions.

It's important that you discuss any concerns you have with your doctor."

Long COVID is a new condition and health experts are still learning about it.



The coriander (pictured left) has been prolific throughout the cooler months and a delightful garnish for red curry pumpkin soup- truly a warming bowl.



Are your Medicare details up to date?

Services Australia boss Hank Jongen has advised Australians to make sure your bank details with Medicare are up to date.

"Right now, there's \$200 million of outstanding Medicare rebates owing to people that we simply can't pay because we don't have their bank account details."

He says all Australians should check that their bank account details on myGov and in the Medicare app are correct.

This may seem obvious, but if you haven't told Medicare about your new bank details, they aren't able to pay you the benefits you're owed, Mr Jongen said, adding that the easiest way to update your bank details is online through your Medicare account linked to myGov, or in the Express Plus Medicare app.

<u>Here's how.</u> On a computer, go to myGov and sign in. If you're using the app, open it and enter your myGov PIN. Then select 'View' and edit your details. If you need to make changes to your bank details, select 'Edit' next to 'Bank details'. Be sure to sign out to ensure your privacy and security.

"Once you've given your new bank details, any refunds you're owed will be paid to you automatically," Mr Jongen said.
