The final Kendall PhiloMusica concert for 2023 will be presented on 19th November at 2 pm at the Kendall School of Arts.

It will feature the amazing pianist **Nicholas Kennedy** (pictured on right) who performs works by Handel, Beethoven and Brahms. Nicholas Kennedy will also attend the pre-concert talk at 1 pm on the day (free with the concert ticket).

Acclaimed for his "stirring, magnetic and powerful" performances (Arts Hub), Sydney-born Nicholas Kennedy is among Australia's most exciting young musicians.

Nicholas made his concerto debut in 2014, performing Beethoven's Piano Concerto No. 1 with the Kuring-Gai Philharmonic Orchestra. He has subsequently appeared in Germany, the United Kingdom and throughout Australia.

Besides performance, Nicholas is

deeply engaged with music research, focussing on piano music of the nineteenth century and the intersection between analysis and praxis.

An award-winning article on Chopin's Fantasy Op. 49 has appeared in The Chopin Review, and in October 2023 he will be a presenter at the international artistic research symposium, Performers(') Present, in Singapore.

His debut album, featuring Beethoven's last three piano sonatas, was released on the Orpheus Classical label in 2021 and is available on all major streaming platforms.

Goetz Richter, Artistic Director of the Kendall National Violin Competition recently attended a recital by Nicholas Kennedy and immediately decided that "Kendall must hear this brilliant young musician". His Intuition was confirmed



when Nicholas agreed and informed him that his great-grandmother grew up in Kendall!


Our last riding days for the year will be Tuesday 5th December and Wednesday 6th December, celebrating with our Riders a special Christmas morning tea on both days.

KEW TOWN CENTRE TRANSFORMATION OPENED!

Port Macquarie Hastings Council (PMHC) has completed its \$2.1 million transformation of the Kew town centre, delivering a more modern and accessible main street for businesses, tourists and residents alike. The grand opening was held on Tuesday 10th October 2023.

Local contractors Eire Construction successfully delivered the work on behalf of PMHC, which includes new road resurfacing, new footpaths, new raised pedestrian crossing, new roundabout and medians, new feature walls, formalised car parking and new garden beds.

The project, which received an \$800,000 grant through the Australian Government, \$400,000 from Round Five of the NSW Government's Stronger Country Communities Fund and \$200,000 from Transport for NSW - Centre for Road Safety, also included the reconstruction of the main Ocean Drive/Nancy Bird Walton Drive and Kendall Road roundabout, landscaping, kerb and guttering. PMHC also invested \$800,000 into the upgrades.



Logans Crossing Bridge, the first of five major bridge projects delivered under the NSW Government's Fixing Country Bridges (FCB) program was finally officially opened on

The Produce Exchange

The Produce Exchange is a community idea for eliminating waste from your vegetable garden. If you have excess produce, bring it along to our meeting place, and exchange it with other growers.

We meet every Sunday at the Kendall Oval, diagonally opposite Kendall Railway Station, on the corner of Railway Street and Araluen Street from 10am till 11am.

Here's what happens: We bring along what we have - a few onions, some shallots, a bit of spinach or some cut flowers and show our produce to the other growers.



We then have a cup of tea with a slice of cake and talk to everybody. Often the conversation deals with topics such as: how to grow, when to harvest, how to preserve or dry vegetables and fruit, and what can be made from the produce.

Because we have people here from different cultural backgrounds, we are often introduced to unusual vegetables that

Recipe of the Month ...

Ingredients:

250g malt biscuits 390g condensed milk ¾ cup brown sugar – firmly packed 90g butter 2tbs golden syrup 200g dark chocolate melts



Method:

- ⇒ Lightly grease a 27cm slice tin with cooking spray. Line bottom with approximately 15 whole biscuits. Crush the remaining biscuits.
- \Rightarrow In a large saucepan place the left over crushed biscuits, condensed milk, butter, golden syrup, and brown sugar.

we have never seen before. At around about 10.45, we ask people if they would like to take home some of our produce, and the goods are exchanged in an informal way.



We don't want to go home with our own vegetables, so it's good to swap with people. If we have a lot of citrus when it all comes into season, the excess can be picked up by Ozharvest.

We started about 6 months ago, and now have a shared seedbank. Because it is spring, our growers are keen to put in seedlings, so we now deal in potted flowers and vegetables. Cut flowers are always popular, as is cut greenery, so if the vegie patch is not quite producing, these are very acceptable.

Come along and join the talk about how to grow, preserve and eat all the wonderful produce that this region offers.

We are a friendly bunch and love to welcome new people. Come along and check out what we do.


~ Writer's Corner ~

The educational aspect notwithstanding, Henry enjoys getting to know some of our community elders and there is always delicious cake on a Thursday.


About 10 years ago a fence was built around the garden to help make it safer for young children; it has also proven to be a handy trellis to grow roses, berries and flowers.

Kendall CWA's 1st Birthday was celebrated in September 1953.

Branch meetings were held in afternoons at members' homes.

It became obvious that Kendall needed a baby health clinic as the ladies would take their babies on the "fish train" from Kendall to Wauchope to have their babies checked out.

It was decided in June to write a letter to the Department of Public Health in Sydney to lobby for a Baby Health Centre to be established in Kendall. By August there was progress in establishing the baby clinic.

In April 1954 Kendall CWA had a discussion with the War Memorial Committee and it was decided that the War Memorial Committee would build premises for the Clinic and Community Meeting Rooms on the RSL site. It was agreed that Kendall CWA would subsequently furnish and maintain the baby clinic. The long awaited baby clinic was opened in April 1955.

The Branch has continued to work and support the local community over the last 70 years and we have about 26 members at present.
