Kendall's Tin Hta Nu was one of three finalists in the NSW Senior Australian of the Year!

Kendall local Tin Hta Nu was one of the 15 finalists of the recent NSW Australian of the Year awards. Her nomination was put up by Mid North Coast Refugee Support Group (MNCRSG) which Tin founded in 2011.

There are four categories of the finalists and among them one each is selected. These categories are Young Australian of the year, (four finalists) Senior Australian of the year (three finalists including Tin), Australian Local Heroes (four finalists), and Australian of the year (four finalists).

On Monday 13th November the finalists were invited to the Government House in Sydney to attend a morning tea offered by the Governor of NSW the Hon Mrs Margaret Beazley and were applauded for the work contributed by all the nominees, adding that everyone is equally valuable in their fields of voluntary work and expertise.

In the evening of 13th November the NSW Australian of the Year Award ceremony was held at The Museum of Contemporary Arts. The Premier of NSW congratulated the 15 finalists stating they represent the very best of our nation - their efforts have saved lives, strengthened communities and helped people most in need.

He also said as well as being a great honour, the finalists and recipients have a chance to take the message to the wider audience.

Tin was found to be among many who are doing good for humanity, environment and culture which has given her a lot of inspiration to do more work for those to whom she has committed - the refugees, disadvantaged people in our region, community garden, and children of rural poor in Burma. Tin said, "My dedication to these causes is because Australia saved my life so I want to give back. I also feel that

reaching the finalist stage is not my effort only, but the support of my husband Ian Oxenford and friends from the organisations to which I belong, MNCRSG, Kendall Op Shop, Kendall CWA, Camden Haven Community @3, and Kendall Community Global Food Garden."

HISTORY OF THE KENDALL SHOWGROUND



Interest in creating an agricultural showground dates well back into the history of the Camden Haven area.

At a meeting of the Agricultural Bureau in 1931, a motion was carried that a Junior Farmers Club be formed at Kendall. The Bureau consisted of a Committee of Samuel Boyd (Chairman), G H Parker, A Baker, A S Usher, H Wilmen, H Delves, D Laughlan, A E Clark, E Wallace and W Webber. A show was held in the school grounds in the autumn of 1932 and was a great success.

However, it was not until 1941 that the next show was held. It was decided that it should be held on the Sports Ground in November of that year. A lot of hard work ensued, poles cut for frameworks to be covered with tarpaulins for stalls, and coops for poultry. The Show was opened by Mr Clive Evatt, the Ringmaster was A Wallace-Smith; with open classes for poultry, horse jumping and a number of stalls.

With World War II came expected difficulties but the 1942 show went ahead.

Soon after in 1944 it was felt that a showground was needed and about 30 acres of land was purchased on Batar Creek Road from Henry Everingham for ten pounds per acre. Two acres were later added from the Smith Estate on the northern end. It was years before the heavily timbered land was cleared and ready for a show.

During 1947 a racetrack was constructed, which required land to be leased from Alex McPhee. The Jockey Club organised this lease. This area was to become the showground in 1948.

In 1948 this three organisations came together under the one flag of the Camden Haven Pastoral, Agricultural, Horticultural and Industry Society, with H W Arnold President and J W Thickett as Secretary. The first Show on this ground was held in 1949.

During 1957, Trustees were set up and they were: Albert Clark, Wallace Chapman, John Flemming, Harold Kelly, Arthur O'Neill, and Albert Wallace.

During the 1950's, golf was played at the showground.

Today the Kendall Showground is home to the annual Camden Haven Show as well as regular equestrian events, Camden Haven Pony Club, Kendall Blues Football Club, Kendall Men's Shed, Camden Haven Boxing Team, Tactile Arts Group Kendall,

Kendall Markets and many, many other functions and events that happen within this magnificent community.

The Kendall Showground is unique, being one of only five privately owned Showgrounds in New South Wales ... that's right, Council does not own the Kendall Showground. That's why our members and supporters are so important. The Camden Haven PAH&I Society has to raise the money for all upkeep, maintenance, and improvements on the grounds.

The Camden Haven Show is one of the oldest, largest, and most popular events in the local district. It holds a special place in the hearts of the people of Kendall and presents a unique opportunity for the local community to showcase its wide variety of expertise and talent through displays and exhibits.

The Show also offers sponsors a unique advertising environment for their products and services.

A not for profit organisation run entirely by volunteers, the Annual Camden Haven Show aims to entertain, educate, and showcase locals!

Camden Haven Show Wrap-Up ... it was FUN!


In general, there were lots of positive comments. It was family friendly, there was variety, it was a great agricultural Show and people enjoyed themselves.

A couple of Side Show people said their takings were better than they had from bigger town Shows. A local side Show operator who was running the Bungee jump took \$3,000 over the two days.

While there was a good feel about the Show, numbers were down in a number of events and exhibits such as Ring events and exhibits in Senior Art, Photography, Cut Flowers and Potted Plants, Cake Decorating, Cooking, Country Pantry and Home Brew.

Cattle and Poultry numbers were up and there was a good showing in the Junior Art, Fruit and Vegies, and quality work on display in the Needlework and Handicraft sections. Chainsaw Racing and Woodchop events were great draw-cards.

There are many jobs in a Show and people just got in and did it with over 90 volunteers and nearly 100 sponsors ... a great team effort. **Thank you!** *Doug Pope* - Show Co-ordinator

Photo on right shows that netting forms an impenetrable barrier to protect from ornithic pilferers





Recipe of the Month ... Bailey's Cheesecake

Ingredients:

BASE

185 g digestive biscuits 100 g butter melted 2 tbs caster sugar *optional FILLING

3 tsp gelatine powder

2 tbs water

500 g cream cheese

15 ml Baileys Irish cream liqueur

300 g sweetened condensed milk

300 ml thickened cream whipped

100 g CADBURY Baking Milk Chocolate grated *to decorate Method:

Base: Crush biscuits and mix with melted butter.

Press evenly into the base of a springform tin and refrigerate while preparing filling.

Filling: Sprinkle gelatine over water in a small heatproof bowl. Microwave for 30 seconds and stir until gelatine dissolves. Cool for 5 minutes.

Beat cream cheese, Irish cream and condensed milk together until smooth. Beat cream in small bowl until soft peaks form. Stir in warm gelatine mixture into cream cheese mixture. Fold in whipped cream and grated chocolate. Pour into springform pan and refrigerate for 4-5 hours to set or overnight for a firmer cheesecake. Garnish with grated chocolate and whipped cream, if desired.

Notes from Meeting held in Kendall Services & Citizens Club, 9th November 2023

BUSINESS ARISING:

- Rubbish Removal, River Street Debb Wilson reported on the marshland adjoining her property on Fagan's Crescent weed growth now covers the remaining items from the major flood (including a fridge) and another flood or drought event were needed to reveal the rubbish. Council have asked for photos and a report.
- Debb also described the drain on to her property from the roadside, which caused major flooding in storm events, which she has reported to Council for 26 years without them taking action. Theo asked that she forward the emails to him for attention. All agreed that we aim to finalise the matter. Action required: Theo, Simon and Greg to investigate.
- <u>Drain at Miss Nellie's</u> –Disappointed at Council's response.
 Action required: Theo, Greg and Simon to discuss with Mayor Peta Pinson.
- Skate Park: PMH Council are asking for submissions by 22nd November. There was significant community support at meeting, but at a follow up zoom meeting only two people attended. The proposed plan was considered disappointing for a skate park less than half the size of that at Lake Cathie, which Kendall community was basing the project on and it was agreed that pressure be maintained for a larger skate area. There was also concern about roadside fencing, with the suggestion that this would be better located on the river side. Everyone was encouraged to make a submission to Council before 22nd November. Action required: Theo discuss with Wendy.
- Kew-Kendall Pathway Nothing to report at this stage.
- <u>Council Delegates:</u> Theo advised the meeting that Simon, he and Greg will meet with the Mayor as soon as possible.
- <u>Bicycle Track</u> Chris Briscoe gave an update. The group is now affiliated, has taken out insurance, and are at present working on a submission – letters of support would help. Membership forms are available on the web site and an increase in membership would help. The Railway Street land and Showground area are each under discussion at present as part of the overall project. Action required: Chris to submit proposal to Secretary Mavis on letters of

- Norrie Park No response has yet been received from Council
- Roundabout at Highway southern end Theo read correspondence received from Leslie Williams and the Minister for Transport & Roads. Barry Barr made the suggestion that the roundabout is illegal. Action required: Greg and Simon to discuss with Mayor Pinson at meeting.
- Local Bridge Signs: The absence of names on Citizens Bridge, Top Crossing Bridge and Buctons Bridge, Lorne were of particular concern. Other bridges on Batar Creek Road were also noted to have missing name signs. Council are to be requested to restore the original bridge name signs.
- It was AGREED that it would be desirable to have a Community Consultation Action Team (CCAT) representative at each meeting to bring a report from CCAT. Waiting for Council to inform us of who the representative is.
- Business Directory: Chairman Theo suggested that a list
 containing the names of all businesses in Kew and Kendall
 be established, with two or three names to be drawn each
 month to become the business of the month and that these
 be the focus of Kendall Chronicle articles; Brigitte also undertook to post on social media. Theo also suggested that
 people representing the businesses be invited to attend
 during the previous month to report on their business and
 the points of focus to be included in the promotion.

<u>PORTFOLIO REPORT:</u> KENDALL SERVICES & CITIZENS CLUB — In introducing Bill Jones, Theo invited people to suggest ways of getting more people involved in the Club, which was striving to increase its membership following a difficult period dealing with restrictions relating to the Covid virus.

Bill Jones (President) then talked about the Club's forward plans now that Casey Baker had been appointed Manager, while at the same time taking back Club responsibility for the kitchen which is thriving. The financial situation suffered during Covid closure – previously the Bank was owed \$80,000 with plans to borrow a further sum to do improvements to the Club, which were not able to be done, then a further \$80,000 was borrowed to keep the Club running; the debt grew to over \$200,000. The AGM will be held on Sunday 26th November without an election. All helped by excellent staff.

• Kendall website – kendall.org.au – The Kendall Community Centre has been paying for the Kendall domain name while delaying active involvement in the website because of need for major restructure. A quote has been received for this work to be undertaken professionally at a cost of \$1,800 which is outside the Community Centre's budget. Action required: \$1,800 required for re-establishment of website.
